Veterans Guest House

More than just a safe place to stay

Veterans Guest House helps former servicemembers and their families during time of medical need. We work to remove common barriers to access to healthcare and are driven by the belief that any veteran who comes to the Reno/Sparks area should have a clean, safe, and comfortable place to rest. For the past 30 years, Veterans Guest House has served as a lifeline for veterans and their families who would otherwise be forced to sleep in their cars or forgo care altogether.

Personal Care and Respite

Rural veterans living alone often struggle to receive specialty care. Without an identified caregiver to help them hospitals cannot schedule operations. VGH now offers a dedicated personal care assistant for guest requiring extra help on a temporary basis.

- Transportation to and from appointments, including surgery
- Assistance with vital tasks like medication reminders, toileting and personal hygiene
- Short term relief to caregivers to arrange their own medical care or get a much needed break





Operation Healthy Home

Recognizing that homelessness creates barriers to healthcare, VGH and karma box have partnered to help homeless veterans and their families.

- Eligible canidates must be sober, employable, and in programming
- VGH provides a temporary home and furnishings
- Karma Box provides wrap around services to prepare veterans for permanent housing
- Together, the two are helping unsheltered veterans get the help and housing they need

Dyana helps me organize my appointment schedule, helps me follow doctor's orders, applies my throat ointment to ease the burning from my radiation, and encourages me to eat even when I don't feel like it. I don't know what I would of done without this help. The cost of a place to stay while having my treatments, appointments, and food I would not have been able to afford. I have made many friends during my stay".


